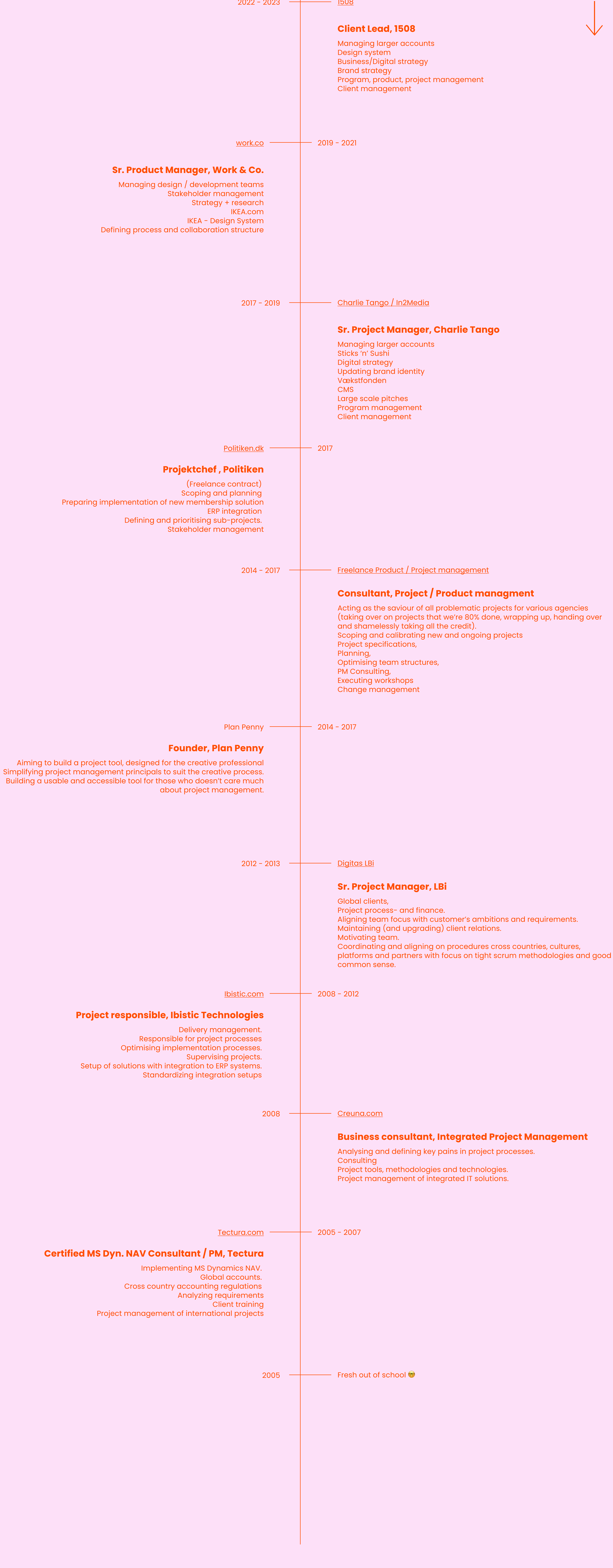
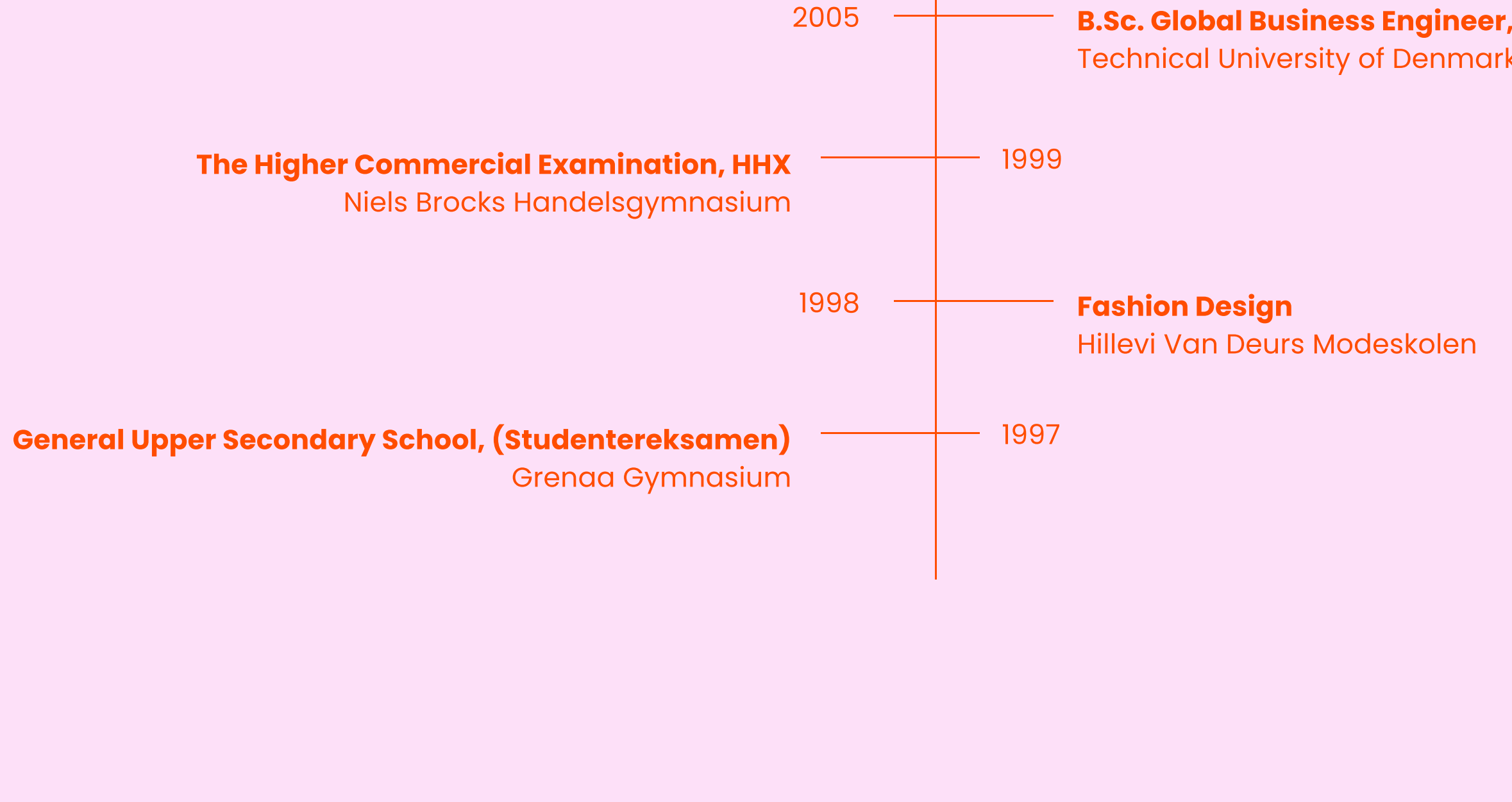

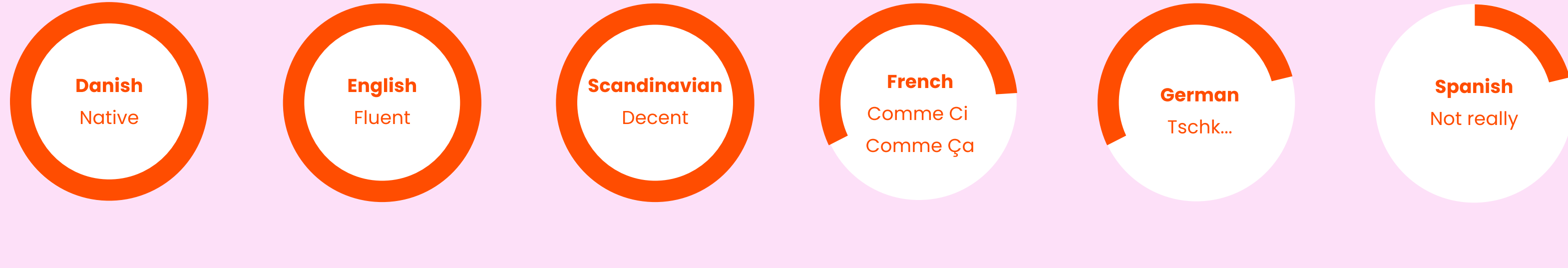

Volunteer Work

- New Loop (2021)**
New Loop is a project that aims to create a refund/recycle system around their app desing and development projects. I presented "real life" client cases to them and they're challenged to develop the solutions based on the case presented. I gave them feedback and guidance during their project, some of them came up with brilliant ideas and solutions that hadn't been considered by "the professionals" in the real life case scenarios.

- Guest Lecturer (2016)**
A teacher friend from KEA asked me to help out with her Interactive Design class, by giving the students a crash course in IT-project management as an introduction to their project work. It was a great challenge to try and concentrate my hard earned experience into a 120 min. lecture, but the students seemed alert and asked some great questions, so I think I did pretty good.
Another teacher friend asked me to come by and help with her arts and crafts class for four-teacher graders, teaching them to create jewelry and clothes from recycled material. A very different experience, but HILARIOUS!
- "Adult" helper at entrepreneur workshop for children (2015-16)**
I used to hang out at the Rainmaking Loft, back in the day when it just opened as a co-working space. I was asked to help out with a one-day workshop for children age 7 - 10, teaching them about innovation and entrepreneurship (no parents allowed). The kids ended up teaching us more than we could teach them with there weird, curious and crooked thoughts and perceptions.
- Mentor for students at IT faculty DTU (2016 - 18)**
I had the pleasure of helping fourth semester students at DTU Ballerup with a their app desing and development projects. - President of the Student Council at IHK (DTU) (2000 - 05)**
As a student at IHK (now DTU) I somehow became part of the board of the student council ("De Studerendes Råd"). After a few weeks I was asked to take the post as the president of the board. They kept re-electing me for the post so not until I graduated was I freed of my obligations to fight for students rights ans tighten the educational environment of the engineering facultees of Denmark. I loved it! Doing the work and collaborating with fellow students on something we all felt was important
- Boardmember SKTs Boghandels Foundation (2001 - 06)**
Besides lobbying to optimise the educational environment I also got involved with some volunteer work as part of the board of the SKTs Boghandels Foundation, where we offered grants to activities that would help the social environment for students at IHK. Projects designed to eg. fight inequality and prejudice at a very non-diverse student environment. I was a little biased as a boardmember since I was often part of the project initiatives that applied for the grants, but we, the board, we're very focused on trying to do the right thing and give the grants to those who most deserved to get them.
